

## Embassy of Japan in the Kingdom of Cambodia The 6<sup>th</sup> Nodojiman "Japanese Singing Contest"

The Embassy of Japan, in collaboration with the Cambodia-Japan Cooperation Center (CJCC), organized the 6<sup>th</sup> "Nodojiman" Japanese Singing Contest for the Japanese learners in Cambodia. The event was supported by the Cambodian Public Bank, CIESF, Sakura Tei, Soundskool, Asia Elite Networks, Locomo, Khmer Rabbit, UMC, Royal Hiroshima, Suzume and Chai Angkor. This year, the Embassy has received application from 170 groups (193 people) from Phnom Penh and Siem Reap. At the audition in January, 30 finalists were selected and entitled to participate in the final contest on Saturday, 21 March, at Angkor-Kizuna Hall, CJCC.



The final contest was held under joyful atmosphere and with enthusiasm with over 400 participants cheering the contestants.
