Good afternoon, everyone. I am pleased to attend this signing ceremony for a grant contract of KUSANONE projects, the Grassroots Human Security Projects, today at the Cambodia-Vietnam Friendship Infirmary.

Since 1991, the Government of Japan has been providing KUSANONE programs in Cambodia in order to directly help local authorities and NGOs which are carrying out their projects. KUSANONE means literally "grassroots" in Japanese. In the last 3 decades, the Embassy of Japan has contributed to 709 projects throughout Cambodia through KUSANONE program. We are pleased that these projects have been directly contributing to improving the quality of life of Cambodian people at the grassroots level.

I would like to introduce the project signed today as follow:

In the project, the Government of Japan provides US\$166,837 (one hundred and sixty-six thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven US dollars) for Procurement of Second Hand Ambulances and Fire Trucks at Cambodia-Vietnam Friendship Infirmary. By providing two ambulances and two fire trucks, it is expected that the infirmary can improve their capacity in case of emergencies, such as coping with more number of patients who need emergency transfers, or handling large fires and forest fires. This project would contribute to secure approximately 20,000 citizens who live proximate to the infirmary.

I am pleased to observe that Cambodia has been rapidly developing recently. However, I also recognize that there are still various challenges to be addressed to improve people's quality of life. Japan will continue to contribute to solving these challenges using various official development aid schemes including KUSANONE.

Last, but not least, I wish you all present here today good health and happiness and further development of the friendship between Japan and Cambodia.

<u>Japan Provides US\$166,837</u> for Procurement of Second Hand Ambulances and Fire Trucks

The Government of Japan will provide US\$166,837 for a recipient organization under the framework, the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects ("KUSANONE" Grant). The Grant Contract was signed today between H.E. Mr. UENO Atsushi, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan to the Kingdom of Cambodia, and the representative of the recipient, to carry out the following project.

'The Project for Procurement of Second Hand Ambulance and Fire Truck at Cambodia-Vietnam Friendship Infirmary in Preah Sihanouk Province' (US\$166,837)

Recipient: Cambodia-Vietnam Friendship Infirmary

In this project, two second hand ambulances and two second hand fire trucks would be adjusted and be provided to Cambodia-Vietnam Friendship Infirmary in Preah Sihanouk Province. The infirmary currently has a limited number of emergency vehicles. Therefore, by implementing this project, it will improve the capacity of the infirmary in case of emergency, enabling it to cope with extended number of patients who require urgent transfers, and handling large fires and forest fires. It is expected that this project would contribute to secure approximately 20,000 citizens who live proximate to the infirmary.

Japan's "KUSANONE" Projects started in Cambodia in 1991 in order to support Cambodia's reconstruction and development at the grassroots level. The assistance aims to protect those who are vulnerable due to various factors such as poverty and/or misfortunes that directly threaten their lives, livelihood, and dignity, as well as to promote self-reliance of local communities. Since 1991, the Government of Japan has provided over US\$66 million for mainly local authorities and non-governmental organizations to implement 709 KUSANONE projects throughout Cambodia.
