

# Relief Money in Response to the Earthquake Centered in the Kumamoto Region of Kumamoto Prefecture 2016

Embassy of Japan in Cambodia

Following the Earthquake Centered in the Kumamoto Region of Kumamoto Prefecture 2016, the Government of Japan decided to accept relief money from foreign governments, foreign individuals, companies and Japanese residents abroad, in the following manner:

## 1 Information regarding the Account of the Embassy of Japan in Cambodia for Relief Money

(1) The Embassy of Japan in Cambodia has opened the following account to accept relief money. Donations are accepted at this account until 31 March, 2017. The account is in US dollars.

(Note) The relief money received by the Embassy of Japan in Cambodia will be sent to the account of the Government of Japan later. Applications for donations (Gien-kin) to the Japanese Red Cross Society were closed on 30 June, 2016. ("Gien-kin" is funds sent by the Japanese Red Cross Society to affected local governments and municipalities, which are then given to affected people.)

(Note 2) After relief money is received by the Embassy of Japan in Cambodia and sent to the account of the Government of Japan, the money will be delivered to the affected people through local governments.

5. The name of the bank from which the relief money was transferred

(3) The Embassy of Japan in Cambodia also accepts donations from those who visit the Embassy in person on weekdays from Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Embassy would appreciate it if donations could be made in US dollars.

## **2 Information regarding the Account of the Japanese Red Cross Society**

The Japanese Red Cross Society ended accepting relief money (Kyuen-kin) from overseas Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, governments, and individuals on 15 June, 2016. (“Kyuen-kin” is funds that are directly used by the Japanese Red Cross Society to perform relief and rescue operations related to this specific earthquake disaster).
