

## **Embassy of Japan** in the Kingdom of Cambodia

Speech by H.E. Mr. Masafumi KUROKI
Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan
to the Kingdom of Cambodia
On the Occasion of the Ground-Breaking Ceremony of the
Project for Replacement and Expansion of Water Distribution Systems
in Provincial Capitals"

## 19 July, 2012

- Excellency Mr. SUY Sem, Minister of Industry, Mines and Energy
- Excellencies Deputy Governors of Pursat Province, Battambang Province, and Preah Sihanouk Province,
- Excellencies, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is a great pleasure for me to attend today's ground-breaking ceremony for the "Project for Replacement and Expansion of Water Distribution Systems in Provincial Capitals of Pursat, Battambang and Sihanoukville".

First of all, I would like to express my gratitude to H.E. Mr. SUY Sem, Minister of Industry, Mines and Energy for his presence at this ceremony.

Today, I am happy to witness the beginning of the Water Supply Project which will contribute to the welfare of the population of three Provincial Capitals, namely Pursat, Battambang and Sihanoukville.

Access to safe water is one of the Cambodian Millennium Development Goals, which contribute to the improvement of living and health conditions and to the

poverty reduction of the population. Accordingly, Japan has been providing its

assistance for the improvement of water supply systems in Cambodia since 1990s.

The Government of Japan has been providing its assistance for water systems in big

cities such as Phnom Penh and Siem Reap where the population is increasing

rapidly as well as rural water supply in the villages in Kampong Cham Province.

Concerning the provincial capitals, access to safe water is still very low due to the

deteriorated water treatment plants and old and insufficient distribution pipelines.

The Government of Japan has decided to provide its grant aid of 2.76 billion

Japanese Yen, equivalent to 34 million US dollars, for this Project in order to

replace and expand water distribution pipelines in the capital cities of Pursat,

Battambang and Sihanoukville. This Project will increase significantly the number

of population who can benefit sate water supply in these capital cities and reduce

water-borne diseases.

I expect also that the new water pipelines will be maintained by the staff of local

water supply authorities, who have received technical training by Japanese technical

cooperation project.

I hope that the Project will be implemented smoothly and successfully with the

target date of June 2013 and contribute to the improvement of living conditions of

the population concerned.

Lastly, I sincerely hope that this cooperation from the people and Government of

Japan will further strengthen the friendly relations between Japan and the Kingdom

of Cambodia.
